



## COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS REPORTS

### SES

Ms Greenhalgh reported that training continued.

There are now three units in Eastern Capital City Regional Shire.

Ms Greenhalgh tabled an Emergency list that the SES intends to deliver to each household. It was suggested that minor changes be made to the list. The lists will be copied and laminated at the school. The SES will attach magnets to the lists then deliver them. Mrs Sandow moved that association pay the costs of producing the list. This is expected to be about \$15.00. The committee agreed.

### SWIMMING POOL COMMITTEE

Mr Marshall reported that he had requested that council not raise the cost of entry to the pool.

Council approved the request.

Mr Marshall told the meeting that he would place an entry in the 'Captains Flat Telegraph' advising of the AGM of the committee.

### RURAL FIRE SERVICE

Mr Quinn reported that there was a fire on 'Chippendale' with a 2 km front. The smoke was seen at Burra. The fire was contained on the property.

It is intended that the bushfire season commence 1 October. This might be brought forward to 1 September if the conditions do not improve.

Two hazard reductions are planned – at 'Lillydale' and behind the Captains Flat hotel.

The Hazard Reduction Risk Management Committee has not met due to the changes to the council.

### LANDCARE

Mrs Booth said there was no report, as the committee did not meet.

### DIRECTORY

Ms Estbergs tabled the latest version of the Directory on Captains Flat. She asked that the committee advise her of additional items. Mrs Sandow complimented Ms Estbergs on the directory.

### CEMETERY

Mrs Booth advised the meeting took place 13 July at the cemetery with Rainer Rehwinkle, Ms Estbergs, Colin Schofield and the team from Auswide Projects and herself. Mr Rehwinkle had invited council officers but they did not attend.

Mrs Booth tabled the e-mail from Mr Rehwinkle advising of the conditions that applied to maintenance of the cemetery.

She also tabled a draft Joint Management Agreement between Department of Environment and Conservation and Eastern Capital City Regional Shire Council regarding management of the Majors Creek cemetery. Mr Rehwinkle said this could also apply to the Captains Flat cemetery.

### BALL

Approval was sought to establish a Ball Sub-committee. The meeting agreed. The members are Ms Carter, Mrs Sandow, Mrs Blackley, Mrs Iris Heard, Mrs Jean Hunt and Mrs Booth.

The use of the Community Association letterhead was discussed. It was agreed that the sub-committee could use it.

The insurance policy will need to be checked to see if the availability of alcohol will be a problem.

The sub-committee will be seeking sponsorship.

Mr Sandow agreed to be Master of Ceremonies for the ball.

### MARKETS

Customer numbers were down in July. There were more stallholders.

It was confirmed the association's insurance covered the markets.

Queanbeyan rangers have removed signs. These need to stand-alone and not be placed on RTA signs. The signs are also too large.

Mrs Blackley will supply a door prize of lavender products for the next market.

Ms Carter suggested that the Ball Committee provide tea and coffee for the next market, as the restaurant would be closed. Mrs Blackley said she would make soup.

Mrs Sandow asked that care be taken that no fat fall on the ground when barbecuing.

Ms Carter asked Mrs Booth if the Hall Committee would investigate the installation of a ramp in the hall.

#### GENERAL BUSINESS

Mr Marshall raised the issue of the changed arrangements by council for the water rates. He was liaising with council on the issue.

Mr Marshall advised the meeting that council would only meet in Braidwood and Bungendore.

Mrs Booth advised that the real cost of using gas in the hall was \$6.60 per hour. She had written to council asking that they amend their records. She also stated that a new 355 Hall Committee should be formed when council settles down
